When asked to write something for this column, I found myself reflecting on how things used to be when I moved my motorcycle business to Gatwick Road in 1996. Back then, I recall having discussions with business colleagues about the frustrations of not being able to get practical things done to make a difference to our neighbourhood.

As any business owner knows, there is never enough time in the day to deal with company affairs, let alone taking time out to lobby officers and councillors at the council about issues such as parking and congestion.

Fast forward and I now feel much more in control of these issues thanks to the presence of the Manor Royal Business Improvement District (BID).

Working collectively with like-minded people from other companies located on Manor Royal, has made a huge difference in tackling the common problems we face. Like many companies, P&H Motorcycles is ever more reliant on technology. Reliable and fast broadband used to be a huge issue - our only option was to pay for an expensive leased line. But today, the successful delivery of superfast broadband in Manor Royal via the BID now means I don't have to do this anymore, and as a result, I am saving more than £6,000 per year.

This is just one example of how the BID has made a positive difference to my business.

I know there were many parties involved and it took a lot of hard work (and perseverance) by all those involved. I really appreciate the work of the BID – I hope you do too.

Best ever 'Know Your Neighbour' expo held

Nore than 300 people representing companies located across Manor Royal packed Crawley's Crowne Plaza Hotel conference centre on Thursday 12 March for one of the BID's keynote events of the year. The Know Your Neighbour expo was our largest event to date, and featured more than 60 exhibitors including Virgin Atlantic, Varian Medical Systems and Siemens Hearing Instruments Limited.

As well as a free business exhibition, a series of seminars were held during the day, including the popular 'Soapbox' session, which provided companies with a two minute opportunity to promote their products and services to each other. Another seminar provided an update from the Manor Royal BID Board, and a third featured a presentation from the University of Brighton on how companies could benefit from its local initiatives.

Trevor Williams, chairman of the Manor Royal Business Improvement District noted the upbeat atmosphere at the event and welcomed the opportunity to meet many of the companies attending. He said: "It was pleasing to see so many businesses meeting in one place and taking advantage of this free opportunity to identify new customers and suppliers, share knowledge and learn more about the activities of the Manor Royal BID."

Michael Deacon-Jackson, director of commercial property firm FTD Johns, said all his team attended the event, reflecting its importance. Made on Manor Royal

t was action stations early one morning on Manor Royal, when a BBC Radio team descended and broadcast for three hours to listeners across its Radio Sussex and Surrey networks. The live programme, presented by Danny Pike and Adrian Harms, formed part of a week-long celebration of all things manufacturing in the counties.

It was a complex show, featuring live interviews with employees working on the factory floors of four manufacturing companies located at Manor Royal. Thankfully, the Prowse team had scoped out the morning with the BBC crew the previous week on behalf of the Manor Royal BID, and all arrangements were in place for the big day.

The morning kicked off at 9.00am with an interview with Steve Sawyer, Manor Royal BID's executive director, who was interviewed about the Business District, now home to more than 500 companies and 30,000 employees.

Then, at Elekta, presenter Danny Pike spoke to Dee Mathieson, senior vice president and Brett North, marketing director, Oncology. They talked about the company's pioneering work in the treatment of cancers. Incredibly, Elekta's high tech products treat more than 1 million patients around the world every year.

Roving reporter Adrian Harms was on standby to undertake a series of live interviews across the business district - the first of which was at Vent-Axia in Fleming Way. For over 75 years, Vent-Axia has set the standard for ventilation and holds a prestigious Royal Warrant. The company first moved to Manor Royal in 1959 and has seen many changes since then.

Jenny Smith, marketing services manager said Vent-Axia was delighted to have been involved in the radio show. "We would like to thank the Manor Royal BID team for arranging the BBC visit and for inviting us to take part," Jenny said. "We were thrilled to have had the opportunity to tell our story alongside other Manor Royal manufacturers and showcase British manufacturing excellence."





Then, cutting back to Elekta's factory floor where Steve Sawyer was joined by Rosemary French, executive director at the Gatwick Diamond Initiative to discuss the potential impact of expansion at Gatwick Airport on the business district.

Crompton Way was the next stop for reporter Adrian Harms and his live interviews at Frontier Pitts and then Heyland & Whittle. Frontier Pitts is a successful British manufacturer of security gates, automatic barriers, roadblockers and bollards and with customers all around the world, the company has become a leader in its field. Sally Osmond of Frontier Pitts, said the firm was keen to highlight the wide variety of products manufactured on Manor Royal and in demand worldwide.



From security to spas, Adrian Harms then visited Heyland & Whittle – manufacturer of luxury handmade soaps, candles and home fragrances.

Subway upgrade on track

Manor Royal BID has secured funding from both West Sussex County Council and Crawley Borough Council to improve the subway entrance to the business district at Woolborough Lane.
