BID rules and proposed rates: Steve continued with the presentation and highlighted the importance to understand the BID rules and rates and where they sit nationally. Levy rate: 1% currently will rise to 1.1%	
Levy cap is currently £3,500 and will rise to £4,000 (maximum levy bill any business will receive). Steve noted that this is way below the average rates and ranks in the lower quartile on most measure compared to other UK BIDs and is incredibly competitive.	The BID to
Tim Rose mentioned that he feels the business plan is really strong however "are we communicating that this is best value for BID's nationally?" Steve agreed this was a good point and a message we want to capture.	include these key messages in all comms
Jeremy Taylor noted that in the business plan on page 4-7 it states that "over £2.5 million attracted by the BID, with a further £2.5 million going forward" this is a powerful message. Steve Sawyer agreed that this is a key message and will be highlighted in the BID comms.	
Variation Policy: Steve advised that a variation policy will be included in the rules and the board has the discretion to increase the levy in line with inflation. The BID has never had to do this, and no plan to but it will be there to protect the BID. Inflation has always been a steady level, however, now needs to be a consideration. Rate of CPI from 2 <sup>nd</sup> year onwards was thought to be the best option by the Board.	
Revaluation: All business rates will be revalued in April 2023, however the BID will set the rate against the 2017 rates so when businesses are voting they know exactly what they will be paying, and this won't change. Tim Rose agreed this was an important point along with the importance of the £4k cap, that the Board all agreed with to ensure that businesses can budget each year.	
that the Board all agreed with to ensure that businesses can budget each year. Sustain and Renew: Steve explained that this is new BID objective, totalling 5 objectives. Although work in this area was already happening it was seen as vitally important to highlight Sustainability as an objective in its own right.	
CCTV: Conversations have been taking place with the police, to upgrade cameras and add to them with a redeployable camera that can be moved to hot spots as an when required.

	Clem Smith advised that the Borough Council are in support of the BIDs continuation and on 5 October this will be highlighted to cabinet and advised he is confident this will be agreed. Steve Sawyer gave his personal thanks for Clem's support Paul Mcconalogue said he thinks the business plan is a fantastic, clear and compelling document. Kevin Willsmer also agreed seconding Paul. 3	Projects update, including Town Deal and Crawley Growth Programme updates	
	Steve Sawyer gave an update on the Crawley Growth Programme Phase 2 – what now and next. Around County Oak – there are raised tables and crossing points to prevent car cruising going in. The One-way system is currently on hold yet as the booking system for the TIP has worked to reduce congestion around this area.	
	The road works on London Road have been causing some congestion.	
	The roundabout by Crawters Brook has had some improvements but the road surface isn't part of the plan.	
	Steve Sawyer advised that WSP are in the process of costing to resurface the roundabout and then the BID can take a view of how to tackle this with the council.	
	Bob Lanzer advised that WSP has been commissioned by the Crawley Growth Programme, and that he will write to the local MP to support the resurfacing. Paul Jackson – Cole advised that work is due to start with Landbuild, the roundabout is outside that area. The circulation of the roundabout will be looked at and what the cost is, so not to leave an incomplete part of the project in the public eye.	
	Bob Lanzer noted that The BID has demonstrated the importance of communication of	
	intentions. Rachel Thomas highlighted her frustrations with roadworks and seeing no activity and not knowing what is going on and when it will end. Steve Sawyer advised he will send the timeline for roadworks so all can be clear. Steve Sawyer also noted that he we will find out the programme for City Fibre.
