Information about the Manor Royal BID Business Rangers Service

The Manor Royal BID Business Ranger was officially launched at the Manor Royal BID AGM of September 2017. The service is currently provided by local security company - Blue Light Security.

The role of the Rangers is to provide a highly visible, approachable, uniformed presence on the streets of the BID area for staff, visitors and businesses, and to act as the eyes and ears of the BID company, dealing directly with a defined range of issues and escalating and reporting any other issues to the appropriate authority where they can't be resolved by the Rangers.

About this report

This report provides an overview of the key activities carried out by the Manor Royal BID Business Ranger Team between January 2024 and December 2024. It serves as a summary of activities to demonstrate the impact the team is making across the Business District during the year.

As well as carrying out 1,000s of welfare checks and visits to businesses, where possible local Manor Royal based businesses are used to supply equipment, including vehicles, to the Blue Light Group to support the Manor Royal operation.

Success Stories

Case Study #1 Prolific shoplifter sentenced.



Business Rangers help to stop a prolific shoplifter in breach of multiple behavioural orders and one count of using insulting/threatening language.

He was later sentenced to three years and three months at Lewes Crown Court.

Case Study #2 Wanted man detained.





Upon receiving a call from a retailer about a possible shoplifter, the Business Rangers quickly identified the individual as matching the description of a wanted criminal identified on DISC (Business Watch system) for a string of offences and for not appearing in court.

The Rangers detained the individual until the Police arrived, whereupon he was safely handed over to the Police.







Community Matters

It's not all about crime. The Manor Royal Business Rangers also help to support vulnerable people they come across and perform small – and occasionally not so small – acts of kindness assisting the emergency services or sometimes simply lending a hand to those that need it.





Rangers on patrol


Towards the end of the year the Rangers covered approximately 500 miles in month while doing vehicle patrols.

However. In the last three months they increased the volume of foot patrols and the number of business visits.

The Rangers also made more stops in the latter months of the year.









Rangers the "eyes and ears"

Being a Business Ranger is more than just security and crime. The Rangers also act as the "eyes and ears" of the Manor Royal BID by checking on businesses, looking out for problems around the area and reporting on things like rubbish, broken furniture and parking issues.

Where they can, they look to resolve the issues themselves, but where they can't they will escalate it to whoever can e.g. the Manor Royal BID Maintenance Team.








Crime Statistics

Every month the Manor Royal BID collects crime statistics for Manor Royal, broken down separately for Zone 1 (County Oak) and Zones 2-5 (the rest of Manor Royal). This is because retail related crime accounts for most crime reported to the Police.

Generally, official crime data show a trend of fewer reported crimes throughout the area. However, it is still very important that all crime is reported to ensure a true picture is captured as it impacts the Business District.







Security related services provided by the Manor Royal BID

As well as the Business Ranger Service that provides dedicated security to Manor Royal in additional to whatever the Police are able to provide, the BID also provides a variety of other services to help to keep the Business District safe and working, including:

- Free access to the password protected Manor Royal Business Watch Scheme (DISC)
- Area-wide CCTV and ANPR security cameras
- Free security radios for vulnerable retailers
- Support from a dedicated Business Crime Manager
- Free business watch window stickers and police officer vinyls
- Affiliation with Crawley & Gatwick Business Watch
- Free site premises security patrol signs
- Free site security review (via the Blue Light Group)
- Access through the BID to the local policing and Council teams
