

This year has been notable as it marks 75 years since Manor Royal was named by Princess Elizabeth in 1950.

Through ups and downs, Manor

Royal has evolved, changed, survived and thrived. The road has been a winding one, it always is, but the trajectory is one of growth and this year has certainly not been without its highlights.

We installed the Hazelwick Flyover Mural to improve this important entry point, we opened the Manor Royal Central Superhub and park area, the road widening and bus lane extension along Manor Royal road was completed, the Crawley Innovation Centre opened, Crawley Borough Council signed a contract to secure new investment in gigabit speed broadband infrastructure for Manor Royal, we started (and at the time or writing) hope soon to finish the next phase of work at Crawter's Brook People's Park and will move quickly onto our next project.

At Manor Royal Matters we elected three new directors and launched the Green Infrastructure Plan, our vision for a greener, more biodiverse, more nature friendly and healthier business district.

We celebrated the successes of Manor Royal companies with the first Recognition Awards to highlight good practice, organised a Charity Treasure Hunt in support of Crawley Open House and piloted the free to access CSR Brokerage Initiative with the RPD Foundation to help companies of all sizes to easily give back to

their community in meaningful and rewarding ways.

The announcement to approve the Northern Runway at Gatwick is also significant, setting the scene for development to come.

We know big changes are to come, not least as part of Local Government Reorganisation and all that means for local democracy and services. However, if 2025 is anything to go by, there is still plenty to celebrate.

Manor Royal Matters Conference Celebrates 75 Years of Innovation and Outlines Future Growth

The Manor Royal Business Improvement District (BID) hosted its annual Manor Royal Matters Conference on November 4, 2025, at the Crowne Plaza Hotel, drawing over 130 attendees from the Manor Royal community and BID partners.

The conference provided a platform for interactive discussions on key developments shaping Manor Royal. Attendees participated in live polling to share ideas on the area's needs, fostering collaborative insights into its ongoing transformation. A highlight was the premiere of a new video tracing Manor Royal's history over the past seven and a half decades, dating back to its naming by Princess Elizabeth, who later became Queen Elizabeth II.

Break-out sessions delved into critical topics for the area's future:

- In "Gatwick Matters," Richard Lennard and Gareth Sear from London Gatwick explored the Northern Runway project, the Airport Economic Zone, and initiatives to bolster the local economy.
- "Sustainability Matters" featured Marc Tomes of Allen Scott Landscape Architecture launching the Manor Royal BID Green Infrastructure Framework, outlining a vision for a greener, more biodiverse Manor Royal through enhanced environmental practices.
- "Devolution Matters" brought together Ian Duke, Chief Executive of Crawley Borough Council, and Leigh Whitehouse, Chief Executive of West Sussex County Council, to discuss impending changes in local government and the delivery of public services.

Steve Sawyer, Executive Director of Manor Royal BID, reflected on the event: "My thanks to everyone that came along and supported the event. It was important for us to share the progress the BID is making and to understand that 98% of respondents reported being satisfied with Manor Royal and that the BID is focussed on delivering the right things for the

Our performance

Highlights from projects and services delivered in the past year

The Manor Royal BID delivers place-specific improvements in line with our Business Plan to make the Business District a better place to work and run a business. These pages provide an insight into the impact the Manor Royal BID has had in the last year, using performance data where it is available. Without the Manor Royal BID these things would not have happened

- More funds: Over £382k of additional funds attracted for BID projects for every £1.69 of BID Levy we attracted another £1 from somewhere else.
- Value: Only 10% of income spent on central costs.
 Well below industry standards of not more that 20%
- Winter gritting: service activated 9 times covering 45 kilometres of highway not otherwise gritted.
- Gateway enhanced: Hazelwick Flyover (Gateway 1)
 Mural completed in partnership with Creative Crawley and
 part-funded by Crawley Towns Grant.

Training

37 courses delivered as part of the Manor Royal Training programme saving companies over £51k



- Additional Security: Business Ranger Service (security patrols, reassurance, security advice, police liaison) providing an additional 3,828 hours of dedicated security cover.
- Additional Maintenance: provided by the dedicated Maintenance Team to keep Manor Royal clean, tidy and well-presented collect over 20 tonnes of waste and fly-tipping
- Cheaper travel: Almost 100 businesses and 1,000s of staff registered for an easit travelcard saving businesses over £190k in membership fees, plus savings for their staff
- Reassurance: Dedicated Business Rangers carry out over 5,000 unique non-retail business visits and over 3,000 retailer visits, attending almost 200 incidents.
- **Digital signs:** Each digital advertising screen kept operational 16 hours per day across fours locations, at massively reduced rates.

- **Communication:** 10,000 copies (four issues) of Manor Royal News magazine printed and posted to all, totalling 164 news stories and articles.
- **Communication:** 12 monthly ebulletins sent to average audience of 1,500 per issue
- **Training:** 37 sessions delivered, attended by 357 delegates, collectively saving over £51k
- **Job posts:** 716 Jobs posted on the free to use jobs board saving companies over £268k and generating 1,359 job applications.
- **Events:** 8 events took place attended by circa 1,800 delegates (includes Know Your Neighbour, Manor Royal Matters, People Conference, Manor Royal Careers Fair, and the Christmas Event)
- New facilities: Crawter's Brook People's Park and Woolborough Lane enhancements and planning applications submitted. Consent granted for Crawter's Brook in July 2024.
- Security radios: provided to vulnerable retailers in County Oak and Acorn Retail Parks.
- **Charity social events:** 6-a-side football tournament and Christmas events raise over £1,000 for local charities
- Crime: reported crime in both County Oak and across Manor Royal decreased by 50 on previous year to 273 continuing a two-year downward trend.
- **Communication:** LinkedIn page gains 401 new followers, and across all social media channels Manor Royal generates over 153k content views.

- **Sustainability:** The Manor Royal Travel Survey, part of the Crawley Growth Programme Move It initiative, is delivered generating over 800 responses.
- Security alerts: 263 alerts issued via the DISC (Business Watch) system to provide early warning to Manor Royal companies, in addition to instant messages.
- Watch Members: Over 100 Business Watch (DISC) members saving between £188 and £386 per annum per company providing secure means to receive and share security, crime and related information.
- Sustainability: The Crawley Growth Programme funded Move It initiative is launched and the first 8 in-company roadshows and 1 area-wide showcase event are delivered.

- **Team building:** 152 hours of funded team building sessions organised with Sussex Wildlife Trust at Crawter's Brook People's Park, providing conservation-based volunteering.
- Improved infrastructure: As part of the Crawley Growth Programme, the roundabout on Gatwick Road at the junction with Manor Royal (Gateway 1) is resurfaced.
- Connected Crawley: Informal networking events delivered each quarter in partnership with Gatwick Diamond Business, Crawley Town Centre BID and Freedom Works bringing together businesses from across the town.
- Improved infrastructure: Design work on Gateway 4, Gateway 5 and County Oak Corner Micropark begins.

- Renewable energy: Detailed business case and demand test carried out in respect of ReEnergise Manor Royal, the renewable energy project. New delivery partner, BHESCo, appointed.
- Improved infrastructure: Collaboration with West Sussex County Council and Crawley Borough Council on phase 3 of the Crawley Growth Programme to widen the western end of Manor Royal road to complete the full length dedicated bus lane along Manor Royal in both directions. Work starts in February 2024 and continues throughout the year.
- Partnership: Manor Royal BID commits to work with HEMIKO to explore feasibility for a Manor Royal heat network. Following successful demand and feasibility test, an application for Government funding is submitted.
- **Profile:** Representation of Manor Royal on key national and local bodies including: British BIDs Advisory Board, The Crawley Town Deal Board, Crawley Growth Programme, Crawley & Gatwick Business Watch, Invest Crawley, Crawley Creative Playground and Creative Crawley.
- **Improved infrastructure:** The BID develops a Contractor Framework to appoint contractors to work on future infrastructure and facilities improvement projects.
- **Good governance:** Manor Royal BID achieves British BIDs (industry body) accreditation, a mark of good practice in the management, operation and delivery of the BID.
- **Recognition:** The first Manor Royal BID Recognition Awards are launched to celebrate those companies and people who go beyond "business as usual" to contribute to improving their communities, generating hundreds of entries across seven award categories.
- **Sustainability:** Work begins on the development of the Green Infrastructure and Biodiversity Framework aligned with the Manor Royal Sustainability Action Plan and One Planet Living objectives.

'MOVE IT' 2025 ROADSHOWS: PROMOTING SUSTAINABLE CHANGE ACROSS MANOR ROYAL



Since launching in September 2024 as part of Manor Royal BID's Sustain & Renew programme, the 'Move it' initiative has been inspiring employees across the business district to choose greener, smarter, and healthier ways to travel. Working in partnership with West Sussex County Council, Crawley Borough Council, Metrobus, and EasitCRAWLEY, 'Move it' has developed into a dynamic platform for promoting sustainable transport and community wellbeing.

Throughout 2025, the 'Move it' Roadshow has visited a range of businesses across Manor Royal, sparking conversations about carsharing, cycling, walking, and public transport. Each event has provided employees with practical tools and information, from EasitCRAWLEY travel discounts to Metrobus ticket offers, making sustainable commuting both accessible and rewarding.

This October, the team visited Acron Aviation, where the event drew strong engagement from staff eager to explore alternative travel options. The session highlighted the benefits of active travel for both health and the environment, supported by Crawley Wellbeing, which shared advice on integrating walking and cycling into daily routines. These on-site events have proved invaluable for building awareness and creating momentum toward behavioural change, one workplace at a time.

A major achievement this year was the integration of the CSR Brokerage Pilot Initiative into the 'Move It' partnership, in collaboration with Manor Royal Business District (BID), RPD Foundation, and Crawley Community Action. This initiative connects corporate social responsibility (CSR) goals with local community needs while promoting sustainability. By offering skills-based

volunteering opportunities, it allows employees to leverage their expertise for community well-being, fostering impactful partnerships between local businesses and charities.

The 'Move it' team extends thanks to all participating organisations for their enthusiasm and commitment. Every conversation, pledge, and action contributes to making Manor Royal a cleaner, greener, and more connected place to work. As the initiative continues to grow, it's clear that small steps, like swapping one car journey for a walk, cycle, or bus ride, can add up to real, lasting change.

LOST AND FOUND IN THE MANOR

The next phase of work to develop Crawter's Brook People's Park - recent recipient of the prestigious Green Flag Award - began in October and at the time of writing is expected to be complete.

The project involves the creation of a new viewing platform and seating area and the installation of three new works of art based on the history and heritage of Manor Royal by artist Andrew McKeown.

Andrew's expertise is in sculpture, design and environmental regeneration. Recurring themes within Andrew's work are those of growth, change and renewal and these natural or organic themes are often combined with site specific historical or industrial references.

Andrew was a number of artists chosen to work on the different park areas being created by the BID in Manor Royal. His work will also feature at Woolborough Lane Linear Park, which is the next area the BID intends to start work on towards the end of the year or early 2026.

These new park areas and entranceway improvements are all

supported by contributions from the Crawley Towns Fund and align to the Manor Royal Projects Pack that serves as the spatial vision for a better business district.

CRIME AND COMMUNITY

To some, the Manor Royal Business Rangers - Matt and Evon - will be familiar faces.

Provided by The Blue Light Group there is no such thing as a typical day in the life of a Business Ranger.

A key focus for the Rangers is, predictably, security both in terms of prevention and reassurance. In an average month Matt and Evon will clock up over 200,000 steps on foot patrols and a further 790 vehicle patrol miles going around checking on businesses, visiting the parks areas and responding to calls.

But it's not just about crime and security.

As well as deterring shoplifters, recovering stolen goods and acting as a deterrent the Rangers also support community events and work closely with the police to help keep the area safe and working.

A recent development includes working with Metrobus to conduct some of their patrols on the bus to provide reassurance to bus users and commuters to the area and - maybe - help rest their tired feet a little!

them around the area. It's a difficult job but they are always happy to stop and chat.

THE GATWICK SCHOOL MARKS REMEMBRANCE DAY

The Gatwick School, part of Aurora Academies Trust, recently hosted a moving Remembrance Service which brought together pupils, staff and esteemed guests to honour the sacrifices made by generations past and present.

Among the guests was George Durrant, a 101-year-old Second World War veteran who was accompanied by family members and the Mayor of Crawley, Councillor Sharmila Sivarajah.

Born in 1924 in Battersea, George lived through the Blitz where he assisted his father as an Air Raid Warden and later served with the Intelligence Corps in Burma during the Second World War. His service took him through the Middle East and Asia where he experienced jungle warfare and the resilience required of the 14th Army, also known as the "Forgotten Army".

Following the war, George remained in India through Partition before returning home to England where he settled in Crawley and raised his family, and resumed his engineering career. His life stands as a lasting



testament to the courage, duty and quiet strength of his generation.

During the service, pupils and staff were deeply moved by George's recollections of wartime Britain and his reflections on the value of freedom and remembrance. The ceremony featured readings, performances and a moment of silence led by pupils at The Gatwick School including:

- Skyla, who read In Flanders Fields
- Logan, who spoke about George's life, and
- Kyle, whose performance of Amazing Grace resonated

throughout the hall.

The event concluded with a Q&A, during which pupils asked thoughtful questions about George's experiences and what lessons younger generations can take from them. George closed with the poignant Kohima Epitaph: "When you go home, tell them of us and say, 'For your tomorrow, we gave our today."

Guests in attendance praised the service and the school's pupils for their exceptional respect and maturity, and their contribution to the event.

THE INCREDIBLE JOURNEY OF THE CO-FOUNDER OF CARNEGIE GROUP

How a farrier from Reigate became the co-founder of the South East's premier commercial industrial steel frame construction company.

It's been an incredible journey for David Mindham, co-Founder of Carnegie Group Ltd, one of the South East's most prolific commercial construction companies. A true entrepreneur he went self employed as a farrier at 22 years old and had his own workshop and was training apprentices by the age of 26; shoeing horses led to an extraordinary career driven by the desire to work for himself and combine hard work with nurturing people

Back in 1986 a young man set about his work shoeing horses, a physically demanding career but one that meant being outdoors and having a degree of freedom. Driven by the desire to be the master of his own destiny he built his own business, shoeing horses across the Southeast.

Expanding the farriery business into blacksmithing, starting by making bespoke curtain poles, handmade in his forge that sold in 140 retail outlets.

As he expanded the range from curtain poles, beds, gates etc local builders would occasionally ask him for structural steels. Identifying this as a new commercial venture, he took the business in a new direction as David diverted his focus into structural steel work.

Always the businessman, he knew that steel had a far greater potential in commercial construction and in 2003 David Mindham Ltd. was established. This business went through a variety of different guises as it grew and developed until Carnegie Steel Buildings was established with his old friend,

Simon Barren, whose project management skill and eye for detail



complemented David's ability to envision potential. In 2024 the business expanded further with the addition of an architectural practice, giving Carnegie the ability to offer full service design and construction. Carnegie Group Ltd was created to unite the various businesses under one roof. Initially based on the Kent and Surrey borders the business moved to Crawley in 2025 with bigger premises and room for more growth.

Currently Carnegie Group is on track to becoming a £10m business, which marks an increase of over 1000% in the past 4 years alone. A true success story for the Southeast.

PREPARE FOR THE RENTERS' RIGHTS ACT 2025 WITH KNIGHTS

The tenancy reform measures within the Renters' Rights Act 2025, will come into force on 1st May 2026. The

Ministry for Housing, Communities and Local Government has published an implementation Roadmap setting out three phases:

Phase 1

1st May 2026 for the tenancy reform measures, including:

- Periodic tenancies
- Section 21 abolished
- Cap on rent in advance
- Anti-discrimination measures
- Ban on rental bidding
- Annual rent increases via section 13 notices

- Tenant's rights to request a pet
- Strengthen local council powers and rent repayment orders

This is very important for all landlords and tenants to understand: On 1st May 2026, the new tenancy system will apply to all private tenancies. Existing tenancies will convert to the new system, and any new tenancies signed on or after this date will also be governed be caught by the legislation.

Phase 2


Introduction of the Landlord Ombudsman requirements and the rollout of the new PRS Database from late 2026.

Phase 3

Implementation of the Decent Homes Standard and Awaab's Law (timing to be confirmed, with consultation expected in either 2035 or 2037).
