Manor Royal - it really matters

At the Manor Royal Matters event, held at Crawley Town Football Club, delegates had the opportunity to feedback on the challenges and opportunities they face using electronic voting pads.

Results revealed high levels of confidence among businesses about the year ahead, with 75% expecting to grow. However, that is not without its challenges with 60% highlighting recruitment as difficult. Rising costs were also a challenge alongside generating sales.

Turning to the BID itself, 96% said they were supportive and satisfaction levels with Manor Royal as a place to work and do business were also in the ninety-percent range.

Continued economic uncertainty and COVID were still on people's minds, as were more local concerns about parking, transport, improving facilities and keeping the place tidy. All areas the BID is acting on, as is sustainability that almost 50% of delegates said was an important area to strive for excellence in. Green micro-business wins O2-sponsored Planet Saver category in British Chambers of Commerce awards

The six-person team at Opus Innovations, a manufacturer of healthcare products on Manor Royal, are celebrating after winning the Planet Saver - UK Green Business of the Year 2021 award, sponsored by O2, at the British Chambers of Commerce's annual Chamber Business Awards 2021.

The event, now in its 17th year, is one of the showpieces of the business calendar, highlighting the role of business in delivering growth and prosperity for the UK and local communities.

The judges gave the award to Opus after hearing that in response to the pandemic it produced the only hand sanitiser in the UK to use 100% recycled plastic for its bottles. The bottles are certified by Ocean Cycle which guarantees the plastic has been intercepted before it enters our seas.

The company, members of Sussex Chamber of Commerce, also provides a refilling station at its premises to allow people to re-use their hand sanitiser bottles over and over again.

Sustainable Manor Royal

Awareness of sustainability issues and the impact we are having on our environment is at an all-time high. A recent lpsos MORI survey showed 85% of adults are now concerned about global warming, the highest level since the poll started in 2005.

Something we know is also on the minds of Manor Royal companies. For the past two years attendees of the Manor Royal Matters event have indicated, using electronic voting pads, that achieving excellence in sustainability is important. In 2020 and 2021, almost 50% of delegates agreed that this should be made a priority for improving the Business District.

From waste consolidation, to promoting sustainable travel and exploring renewable energy options, the Manor Royal BID has been active in this area. Perhaps now is the time to take things to another level.

On the following pages is a high-level summary of some of the projects the Manor Royal BID is involved with and what some of the businesses here are doing to contribute to a more sustainable place.

How green can we be?

Recognising the need for successful and attractive places to be sustainable and for organisations, including BIDs, to be clear about their contribution to Net Zero, the Manor Royal BID has engaged a company called Bioregional to explore the potential for Manor Royal to become a more sustainable business park.

Bioregional was founded as a charity and social enterprise in 1994 by Sue Riddlestone OBE and Pooran Desai OBE, two environmental entrepreneurs who wanted to develop more sustainable ways of living and doing business within the resources of our planet.

They created the One Planet Living model in 2003 that provides a framework for assessment against ten principles for living and working sustainably and to create more sustainable places. The framework covers everything from "health and happiness", "Land and nature", "Travel and transport" and "Waste and Energy".

This framework will be applied to Manor Royal over the next few months with a view to publishing an action plan to help guide the Business District on its own Net Zero journey.

Manor Royal's clean energy future

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Energy prices are increasing and, at best, unpredictable. There is growing interest from companies to invest in renewable energy and to generate their own power. However, for many this is either too costly or too

to generate their own power. However, for many this is either too costly or too complicated.

Analysis carried out during the EU-funded BISEPS project showed the clear potential for companies to work together to increase the benefit they get from generating and sharing renewable electricity and heat energy by, for example, jointly purchasing solar panels for their building.

This would allow companies to take greater control of their energy supply and management - making it cheaper, cleaner and more resilient.

A Steering Group made up of Manor Royal companies and stakeholders has been set up with a launch for the Manor Royal Local Energy Community planned for later this year.

New spaces for a greener place

The Manor Royal Project Pack is the spatial vision for Manor Royal and serves as a companion document to the BID Business Plan. It specifically deals with public space assessing its quality, short comings and on-going maintenance requirements.

Previous Project Packs have been instrumental in delivering projects right across the Business District including Crawter's Brook People's Park, The Terrace Pocket Park, the new Micropark areas, key "Gateway" improvements, area-wide signage and initiated a new regime for maintenance.

The Project Pack has also been vital for attracting new investment to Manor Royal in the form of grants and other funding, like the Towns Fund.

As well looking at the potential to deliver more transformative projects, the third Project Pack now being produced by the Manor Royal BID, will come up with ideas for how to "design out" low level issues that undermine the quality of the environment (like grot spots and areas of weak public realm).

It will also have a much stronger focus on how we might create a better environment to support wildlife and nature, capture rainwater and improve air quality while benefitting employee health and wellbeing by adopting different planting schemes, areas of wildflower or tree planting.

The final version of the new Project Pack is expected to be ready for the Know Your Neighbour event in May.

Quantum: Making Wholesaling Greener

Every year the wholesale industry emits hundreds of tonnes of carbon dioxide into the atmosphere. At Quantum we believe in taking responsibility for our contributions to climate change. So we started our Green Initiatives to help combat, and eventually reverse the carbon output of our business.

It all started in 2020 when we made the commitment to reduce our reliance on fossil fuels. Did you know that a delivery van's CO2 output on a 50-mile round is nearly 22kg? Across the industry the damage this practise does to our climate is tremendous; it needs to be stopped. At Quantum we're doing our part by converting to a fleet of allelectric delivery vans

The EV-fleet launched in 2020, and by 2028 we aim to be employing only electric vehicles and using 0 petrol or diesel for our deliveries. But we aren't stopping there. In 2021, we're starting a new Green Project.

Saving the Climate, One Tree at a Time...

Quantum is fighting the climate crisis by planting trees. Starting this month, for every sale Quantum makes we are planting a tree somewhere in the world.



Our partner Ecologi is an expert company specialising in carbon recapture and reforestation. They work hard every day with companies like Quantum to reduce or offset our climate impact. The work Ecologi does is simply amazing, and Quantum couldn't be prouder to be playing our part by donating to their tree planting scheme.

How it works: You make a purchase with Quantum; we plant a tree. It's that simple. The funds for the project are taken entirely from Quantum's profits, so no cost is passed onto the consumer.

Crawley Borough Council Going Green

From their depot in Metcalf Way, Crawley Borough Council provide a range of essential services to residents throughout the town.

It is also home to the Manor Royal BID Maintenance Team who are dedicated to providing additional services to keep the Business District looking clean and tidy.

The Neighbourhood services and Manor Royal Maintenance Team are committed to contributing to the Council's stated aim of getting close to net zero as possible by 2030.

The team in Manor Royal is playing its part in this ambitious target, using equipment like the electric Mean Green ride on mower, electric blowers and electric hedge cutters and wherever possible replacing older vehicles with more efficient and environmentally friendly alternatives.



Litter and fly tipping collected on Manor Royal is sent for recycling. The aim is to recycle as much of the green waste and leaf material by chipping or shredding and reusing as bark mulch to help with weed control.

Since 2020 the Council has created an additional 43 wild flower and natural areas with a wild flower mix of 26 different species of plants that are recommended by the RHS for pollinators and provides a great setting for other bugs, birds and butterflies.

The Crawley Borough Council Depot on Metcalf Way has solar panels on the roof, energy efficient LED lights that cover about 40% of the business. As older units fail the remainder of lights will be replaced and fridges, freezers, Flush systems and hand driers have been changed to more eco friendly appliances that run more efficiently.

Zero Emission Hydrogen Buses for Manor Royal

Twenty new, zero carbon emission, hydrogen fuel cell electric buses begin their journeys from June 2022 on Metrobus' Fastway routes 10 and 20 in the Crawley, Horley and Gatwick Airport area, emitting no more than harmless water vapour.

What's more, they have long range capabilities and can be refuelled quickly in depots. The hydrogen will be fuelled directly at Metrobus' depot in Manor Royal.

These single-decker buses are part funded by UK government and European Union zero-emission bus schemes, alongside a multi-million pound investment by Metrobus.

Passengers will also benefit from quieter journeys, greater accessibility and a more consistently comfortable climate as there are no engines on board. The arrival of the buses from Northern Irish manufacturer Wrightbus means we can move some existing ultra-low emission buses elsewhere, retiring our oldest buses.

But the good news doesn't stop there. Metrobus is working with other local authorities to potentially introduce another batch of hydrogen buses to other Metrobus services operating between Crawley, Manor Royal and Gatwick and on to destinations in Surrey. If successful, this could be Europe's biggest local fleet of hydrogen buses and will mean the majority of services operating through Manor Royal become zero emission.

Manor Royal's rapid transit service, Fastway, is a network of guided busways and dedicated bus lanes designed to speed buses past congestion hotspots. It's one of many examples of excellent partnership work between Metrobus and local councils, including introducing bus priority measures to speed up bus journeys for passengers. Little wonder that Fastway was selected to deploy the fleet of the future.

Go-Ahead, Metrobus' parent company, is the UK's largest operator of zeroemission electric buses, with a fleet of nearly 300 nationwide, but this is the group's first venture into hydrogen. The contract is part of Go-Ahead's commitment to a decarbonised bus fleet by 2035.

One of those is Naked Energy, a British design and engineering business, leading the global innovation in solar heat and power, with a mission to change energy for good. Through the deployment of its technology, the company is decarbonising heating and cooling globally, accelerating the transition to a net zero carbon world.

Heating and cooling buildings accounts for 51% of global energy demand. This demand is currently largely met by fossil fuels and produces 40% of all global carbon emissions.

Unlike electricity, heat is distributed across the economy. It can't be centralised and can't be transported in the same way as electricity. Heat must be generated from a local source. This requires distributed high energy density solutions.

After investing years into research and development for its Virtu product range Naked Energy is now growing at a rapid rate with exciting projects in the pipeline for 2022 and beyond. The Virtu product range is developed to meet the energy needs of heat networks, hotels & leisure centres, multi-family residential developments as well as manufacturing businesses with a need for process heat. The energy transition and solar thermal in particular provide exciting opportunities for plumbers and electricians. It is also estimated that the global solar thermal market itself is set to grow to around \$38 billion USD by 2026.

Naked Energy believes in working with local partners in Manor Royal and would be delighted to work with local installers and help them benefit from the ongoing energy transition.

Laker – A Journey to Carbon Zero

Laker Builders Merchant in Manor Royal is an independent family-run business and are taking the green route towards being carbon neutral.

Having already made good progress by replacing Crittal windows with double glazed units, insulating all offices and shops to reduce energy consumption, changing the lighting system to LED, installing hot taps to replace the kettles, changing to an efficient oil based electric heating system, reducing the paper usage by 90% and many more initiatives. This year also joining Clean Growth Laker are fully on board with Co2nstructZero initiative to drive carbon out of the building industry, with aims to become a carbon reduction champion.

Steve Robinson states "For Laker becoming carbon neutral is a journey made up of many small steps, one of which was calculating our carbon output, so we may hereafter focus where we could make a big difference to the environment and our staff".

"As we are a business looking to grow and diversify, it was important that our partner can think long-term and work with us to support both our green ambitions and the commercial viability of our projects both now and in the future."

LoCASE Business Growth Grants

If you have a small-to-medium-sized enterprise (SME) in Manor Royal, there is a grants and support programme that can help you to become more competitive and profitable, whilst protecting the environment. LoCASE (Low Carbon Across the South and East) encourages low carbon solutions and is backed by the EU and local councils.

Who can apply?

SMEs with under 250 employees, Annual turnover under £44 million and a balance sheet under £39 million. (If the organisation is owned more than 25% by, or owns more than 25% in, another enterprise, they must meet this criteria.)

OK...I'm eligible. But what's it FOR?...

The grant is for up to £10,000, representing 40% of a project's costs, and can be used for energy efficiency measures installed for your business - for example, covering the cost of installation, materials and equipment. Or, if your business offers low carbon (or 'green') goods or services, you can access a business development grant. You can claim for marketing, consultancy, equipment, IT software, product/process development, accreditation and certification...

Here are just a few examples of Energy Efficiency measures you can apply for:

Energy efficient lighting and lighting controls

New heating systems and controls Insulation

Renewables for heat generation to include heat pumps

Multi-function devices to replace

separate printers, photocopiers and fax machines

And some business development examples to consider:

Plant equipment and machinery

IT hardware and software

Certification and accreditation

Facilities hire i.e., specialist lab facilities for testing and R&D

Specialist fees i.e., interpreter, patent lawyers, academics

Travel and Parking News

The Crawley Growth Programme is a town-wide package of improvements, including an investment of over £3.5m to improve key junctions, signalling, crossing points, cycling and walking facilities, a new bus lane, improved bus waiting areas and options to improve parking.

The work will be carried out in a series of phases. Some signal upgrades have already been completed at County Oak with more significant works impacting Manor Royal road, Crompton Way and London Road having started in January and lasting 14 weeks.

Manor Royal Parking Permits

Despite the unprecedented events of the last eighteen months, tackling the perceived transport issues in Manor Royal continues to be seen as critical to our long-term success in sustaining and enhancing the attractiveness of the Business District.

The voting that we conducted at the Manor Royal Matters event last November placed "Tacking Parking and Transport" top of the list of issues to resolve by 67% of delegates. A consistent finding with problems caused by inconsiderate, rogue and long-stay parking previously highlighted among the frustrations.

A previous consultation indicated good support for introducing a parking permit scheme (parking management plan) for Manor Royal that would require permits to be purchased to park in public areas of the Business District and allow better control of available space for Manor Royal staff and visitors. However, COVID stalled introduction of the scheme. Before it is progressed by the Local Authorities we wanted to consult businesses again - two years on - to make sure there is still support for the scheme.
