#### Background to Manor Royal BID's partnership with Sussex Wildlife Trust

The Manor Royal BID was formed in June 2013. Shortly after, in February 2014, the BID partnered with Sussex Wildlife Trust to provide conservation based volunteering opportunities at the then newly created Crawter's Brook People's Park, the single biggest green space in Manor Royal.

A seven-and-a-half acre site in the middle of Manor Royal, Crawter's Brook was largely inaccessible due to neglect, various examples of "land grab" and fly-tipping. Upon the creation of the Manor Royal BID, and with the support of both Crawley Borough Council and West Sussex County Council, a plan was hatched to reclaim Crawter's Brook and turn it into a usable space that balanced the needs of nature and people.

Sussex Wildlife Trust worked with the BID and the appointed architects, Allen Scott, to ensure that the area was developed sensitively. Crawter's Brook People's Park was practically completed in 2014 and was formally opened by the Duke of Gloucester in November of that year, by which time the first volunteer sessions had already been delivered.

Since then, the partnership has flourished and to this day continues to provide guided volunteering opportunities that helps to maintain the park, contributes to health, wellbeing and community and supports the plans of the BID for investing in a more sustainable a bio-diverse future for the Business District.





#### **About this report**

This report provides a review of some of the key activities facilitated out by Sussex Wildlife Trust between February 2014 and July 2024 as part of its partnership with the Manor Royal BID. It provides some highlights of the many volunteering sessions delivered through the partnership, some of the businesses that have taken part and some of the things that have been achieved.

Over the years, and particularly through the adoption of the "Sustain and Renew" objective as part of the BID's latest Business Plan (2023-2028), the partnership has evolved to encompass advice on plans for a more biodiverse business district, including the creation of new micro park areas and the emerging Green Infrastructure Framework for Manor Royal.

This partnership has been one of the BID's most enduring and looks set to continue as Manor Royal BID continues to support plans for a less carbon intensive and more nature friendly area, alongside supporting health, wellbeing and team building via the popular volunteering programme.

# Case study #1 Support for education

As well as supporting businesses and corporate volunteering, the partnership between the Manor Royal BID and Sussex Wildlife Trust has allowed Gatwick Green Space to work with the Gatwick School in different ways through the years.

This has included; forest school sessions at the nearby Gatwick Woodlands, wildlife recording and habitat creation for bugs and insects.









# Case study #2 Power workers lend muscle to wildlife

Volunteers from UK Power Networks Services teamed up with the charity Gatwick Greenspace Partnership to plant a new wildflower meadow at the entrance to Crawter's Brook People's Park, in Manor Royal.

Ginette Leeder, a senior asset systems administrator at UK Power Networks, said: "It's satisfying to do something that really benefits the local community. Everyone enjoys getting out in the fresh air doing something so worthwhile in the local area.

"People may not know about the stream which is nestled in a wildlife corridor in a built-up area. Working on a project like this is a fantastic team building event and we're grateful to get involved." (April 2023)
