That was the message from the "Who cares?" event that took place at Thales at the end of October. More than 120 delegates signed up and 75 took part in an interactive voting session to tease out how the Business Group should fulfil its mission to "promote Manor Royal as the business destination of choice for employers, employees and visitors".

An overwhelming 97 per cent agreed that it was either important or very important that the Business Group works to improve and promote the area.

Among the areas regarded as top priorities were: • Promoting business and trade

- Improving appearance and resilience and Reducing costs and improving facilities

Other issues relating to broadband and parking were also mentioned in the debate that followed.

The event was a key part of trying to engage 200 businesses by the end of the year and sits alongside a programme of faceto-face meetings and other events to find out the needs and wants of businesses and occupiers.

Trevor Williams, Manor Royal Business Group Chair, with Raj Vithlani from Fastsians who produced the Manor Royal banners Delegates were among the first to find out what the Business Group is planning to do and 89 per cent of the audience agreed that what was being proposed covered the right areas.

Having received a definite mandate to move forward, the task now is deliver some immediate actions with the funds already available and to put in place a plan for longer term, on-going activity.

What's the deal?

Manor Royal's biggest single opportunity site - the 30 acre former GSK site off of Manor Royal - has been sold to Exton Estates. A welcome sign of confidence in the area, the site was sold for a reported £9m and is the largest land sale of the year so far.

Local firm Aerotron, as part of their business expansion plans, have acquired and obtained planning permission to develop land to the north of their existing premises in Jenner Road.

At the time of going to press, Lynton Developments had gained planning permission for a major development just north of Manor Royal for a Tesco dot.com home delivery facility.

ISSUE TWO

Safe and sound

Avoiding disruption to normal business activities, protecting staff, property and premises and generally doing what we can to keep Manor Royal working was the subject for "Safe Place, Secure Business" seminar at Virgin in September.

The key message was that Manor Royal is a safe place. While there have been some recent isolated incidents, the crime statistics are in line with expectations for an area of Manor Royal's type and size. However, it is important that steps are taken to send a clear message to deter criminal activity and ensure the area does not get a reputation as a "soft target".

Referring to issues of a major incident, the Fire Service stressed the importance of being prepared, having a plan and providing the emergency services with the information they need.

In response Operation Diamond - the high-level incident response plan for Manor Royal - has been produced. It provides advice about how the area will respond to a major incident and guidance for how Manor Royal businesses can prepare for the worst.

Operation Diamond, including the zonal map to help manage, navigate and organise security and emergency responses, is available online in the Business Life section.

Which zone are you in?

We want to identify volunteers from each zone. Representatives from Zones 2 and 3 have already been found. You will help form the Community Resilience and Security Group for Manor Royal, attend quarterly meetings and be the eyes and ears for your zone. If you are located in zones 1, 4 or 5 and are interested, please contact the Business District Manager.



Note: Zones 2, 3, 4 and 5 cover the "core" Manor Royal area while Zone 1 covers the nearby County Oak, Betts Way and Metcalf Way area.

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Keeping Watch of the Business District

Communication and working together in a coordinated way to deter crime, report incidents, share expertise and receive regular alerts and updates is key to making Manor Royal even safer. It also helps to build a strong community. But it has to be easy, well managed and supported.

Hence, plans to introduce Manor Royal Business Watch (to include a Safer Premises intranet). This will replace the existing email security network and has the benefit of being linked to the existing Crawley and Gatwick Business Watch scheme already covering other parts of the town.

The scheme will be free to Manor Royal tenants and members of the existing email network will be among the first to benefit. Anyone on Manor Royal can sign up for alerts and to become part of the network. Contact the Business District Manager for details.
